The UK Government is allocating £9.6m funding to local councils to assess whether developers are positively impacting nature on their sites.

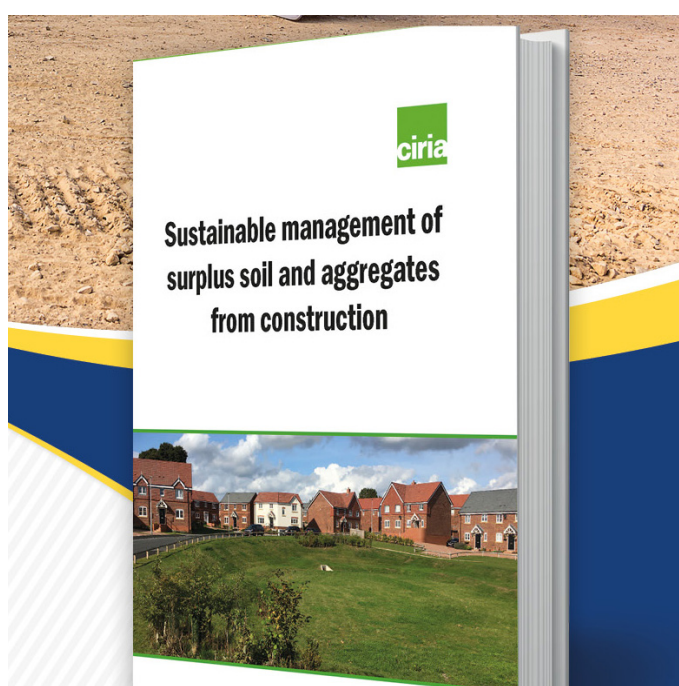

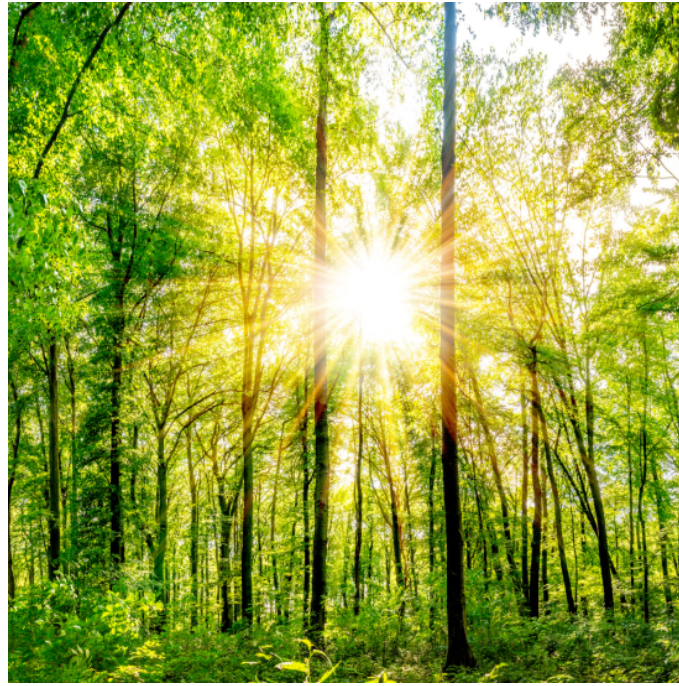
